8. Monthly Open Letters from School Leaders will be our means of communicating to you important information, as well as to update you on our school events. It is also a platform that we leverage on to celebrate the successes of our students and staff. We strongly believe that when our students taste success, they will grow up to be confident children and be motivated to scale greater heights for themselves. Thus, parents, it is important that you spare some time off your busy schedule to read our letters. Softcopies of the monthly Open Letters are also available on our school website.

## ***New Developments in 2017...***

### **Daily cleaning of classrooms and school environment**

9. As you may have already known from the media last month, all schools will have daily cleaning January 2017. As such, all students (P1 to 6) will spend the last five minutes before the school day ends to clean up their classrooms. This aims to provide students with learning experiences which allow them to cultivate good habits for life and also the sense of responsibility for self and others. We seek your support in this by encouraging your child on his/her good effort in school. You may also like to establish a similar routine at home by encouraging your child to make his/her own bed after waking up, put away his/ her books and toys after use, help in simple household chores, etc.

### **'Elevenses' (Snack Break)**

10. Besides the daily half-hour recess break, we will be introducing an additional break between lessons when the new school year begins on Thursday, 5 January. This is to improve our students' well-being, as according to an article on snacking in Kidshealth, snacks can keep younger children from getting so hungry

that they become cranky, and can also keep older kids from overeating at larger meals. Our students will also be able to concentrate better in class. This 10-minute break will take place between 12.15 pm to 12.30 pm each day. As such, please prepare a healthy snack (eg: biscuits, bread, a packet of milk, finger food, healthy cereal bar, fruits [whole and not cut, as cut fruit loses its nutrients easily], etc for your child which can be consumed within 15 minutes.

#### No-Frills Birthday Celebrations

11. Birthdays are an annual joyful event to celebrate our birth, especially for our children. While we understand that you would like to celebrate this day for your children, especially in the company of their fellow classmates, we would like to appeal to all parents not to provide their children with birthday cakes, food items, tidbits, goodie bags, gift packs, etc to share with their classmates in school. The reasons are as follows:

- we want to promote a healthy lifestyle and
- we also want to safeguard our students' safety as some of them may suffer from food allergies.

12. To celebrate the birthdays of our students, the school conducts monthly mass birthday celebrations on the first Friday of each month during the school's morning assembly. At these sessions, the names of students who will be celebrating their birthday in that month will be announced. These students will then be invited to stand and the entire school community will join in the singing of a birthday song for them. Students enjoy this time and feel valued as significant individuals of the QtPS family. Form and Co-Form Teachers will also conduct a conversation with the birthday child during the weekly 1-to-1 Interaction Time.

##### PSLE results

13. We would like to extend our heartiest congratulations to the batch of 2016 P6 students who have done well. 95.4% of our P6 students qualified for Secondary education. The following table shows the mean performance of our students:

#### School Green Awards 2016

15. The school participated in the School Green Awards, an annual environmental audit programme organised by the Singapore Environmental Council. The programme aims to increase the school's level of environmental awareness and encourage each individual to develop solutions and adopt habits to improve their environment. It requires the school to submit information such as its usage of electricity, the amount and type of rubbish generated in different areas in the school and green activities organised by the school.

16. For the School Green Awards, there are four basic levels of awards – Palm, Hibiscus, Orchid and Lotus. We are pleased to announce that the school has attained the Lotus Sustained Achievement Award (the highest award given to schools that have achieved the Lotus Award three or more times consecutively) in the

School Green Awards. Congratulations to all students, teachers and parents involved, especially members of the school's Green Club and its team of dedicated teachers!

### ***Important Announcements...***

#### Chinese New Year Celebrations & Holiday

17. The school will be celebrating Chinese New Year on Friday, 27 January. As that day is the eve of the Chinese New Year, students will be dismissed at 9.45 am. All after-school activities such as remedial/supplementary classes and CCA will be suspended on that day. The following Monday, 30 January, will be a public holiday, while Tuesday, 31 January will be a school holiday. As such, students will only return to school on Wednesday, 1 February. We would like to take this opportunity to wish our Chinese students and their families "A Happy and Prosperous Chinese New Year – 新年快乐 万事如意!" and everyone a good holiday break.

#### Health Check for all students

18. The School Health Service will be visiting the school to conduct the annual health screening exercise. Parents of P1 and P5 students will receive an information booklet on the School Health Service. In the booklet, there is a form where parents need to provide information on their child's past medical history and information on allergies. Immunisation will be scheduled for the P1 and P5 students. Parents with children in these levels will need to sign the consent forms attached in the information booklet.

#### HealthHub

19. HealthHub is a one-stop information and services portal and mobile application by the Ministry of Health and Health Promotion Board. This portal will allow you to access your child's immunisation, dental and school health records, lab test results and medical/ dental appointments (only for Public Health Institutions). You can visit [www.healthhub.sg](http://www.healthhub.sg) or download the app from the Google Play Store or Apple APP Store. After you have downloaded the app, login to MyHealth with your SingPass to access the health records of your child.

#### Temperature-taking Exercise

20. As a preparatory measure, please note that all students are required to have a personal Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) at all times. There will be a Temperature-taking Exercise on **Friday, 6 January**, as part of our standard procedure for safety and security measures. Please ensure your child has an ODT in working condition and brings it to school with immediate effect. A one-time complimentary ODT will be given to our P1 students by the class teacher prior to the exercise. All P1 students will be taught how to use the ODT.

#### Gifted Education Programme (GEP) Screening Test (Only for P3 students)

21. The Gifted Education Branch of the Ministry of Education will be conducting the GEP Screening Test on Wednesday, 23 August. The test is open to all P3 students and it will be based on what students have learnt from Primary 1 to Primary 3 in the English Language and Mathematics syllabuses. A separate letter will be issued to all P3 parents in August.

#### Welcome Party for P1/New Parents

22. Parents from the Queenstown Parent-Support-Group (QtPSG) will be organising a Welcome Tea Party on Friday, 13 January, from 6.00 pm to 8.30 pm, in the school hall. The objectives of this party are

(i) to welcome the parents of all P1 students and parents of new students in the other levels, (ii) to network with other parents and (iii) to explore possibilities of you being part of the QtPSG. #### **Safety and Security Matters**

26. Student safety is our priority. The safety of our students using roads leading to and from the school is the responsibility of all. We need motorists to play their part by slowing down as they approach the vicinity of the school, and parents to reinforce the importance of road safety with their children. Road Crossing in the morning is patrolled by our staff. The road can be very busy and dangerous at this time. Thus, we would appreciate parents being positive role models by using the zebra-crossing too.

27. Attached is a school site map indicating the traffic flow for vehicles entering the school and the location of pedestrian gates. For the safety of our students, please follow the directional signs and instructions from our security personnel. During dismissal time, private vehicles will not be allowed to enter the school. Please make the necessary arrangements to meet your child at the pedestrian gates – either the Canteen Gate or Back Gate.

28. Due to the limited parking lots within the school, we seek your understanding that all visitors to the school will have to park at the public car park adjacent to the school. All visitors entering the school premises are to obtain a visitor's pass from the Security Guard Post outside the General Office. As the security of our students is of utmost importance to us, please comply with our security measures.

#### **Parents' Smartphone Messaging System**

29. With reference to the school's Open Letter dated August 2016 on C2HAMPS (Character, Cognitive and Holistic) Messaging App system. The school has made a decision not to tap the C2HAMPS Messaging system as a platform to communicate between the school and parents due to unfavourable technical issues that had surfaced during the trial session conducted. We will explore and trial alternative communication messaging systems before notifying you of our decision at a later date. We thank you for your patience and understanding. You can contact your child's teachers via email and/ or phone call. The email addressed of your child's teachers will be shared with you via the Year Head letter. Kindly look out for it.

### ***Reminders about School Procedures***

#### **Updating of Student's Personal Particulars Form**

30. We will be issuing your child with a Personal Particulars Form. We seek your help in updating the particulars and returning the form to your child's form/co-form teacher by Friday, 13 January. After this updating exercise, please inform the General Office in writing of any changes to your contact number, address and/or citizenship status. It is crucial that the school has the updated student's particulars so that we can get in touch with you swiftly in the event of any emergency.

#### **Presence in school**

31. Research has shown a close correlation between students' achievement and their attendance. Students who attend school regularly are more likely to accomplish in their studies and enjoy their schooling experience. Attending school regularly during the early school years is especially critical for students as they require a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy, as well as strong social-emotional competencies to cope with the academic demands at the higher levels. In QtPS, we aim to nurture every child holistically, guided by our school's philosophy that "Every Child Matters and can Accomplish".

32. As such, the school expects all students to attend school regularly. The only exceptions for absence are (i) the student is ill and is covered by valid medical certificates and (ii) parents have sought prior permission from the Principal for leave of absence. We seek your cooperation and understanding in ensuring that your child attends school regularly.

33. If your child is not feeling well, please bring him/her to see a doctor and only allow your child to return to school when he/she is feeling better. Any absence from school must be accompanied with either a medical certificate from a doctor or a letter of excuse from you when your child returns the next day.

34. If your child is down with chicken pox, H1N1 or Hand-Foot-Mouth disease, please take your doctor's advice and let your child rest at home. Children have close contact with one another in class and as these conditions are highly infectious, kindly call the school to inform us so that we can monitor the situation with other students in class too. We seek your understanding in this matter as the health of our students is our concern because learning can only take place when our students are healthy and alert.

#### **Insurance Coverage for students**

35. As part of our dedication to student welfare, we have taken an annual insurance policy to cover all students in the event of any injury incurred during school activities. The period of the policy is from 3 January to 31 December 2017. Your child will receive a brochure with details on:

- how to report a claim and the documents which are required;
- methods of submitting claims; and
- the value of the reimbursements related to expenditures incurred.

Do feel free to contact the school for assistance or clarification.


